

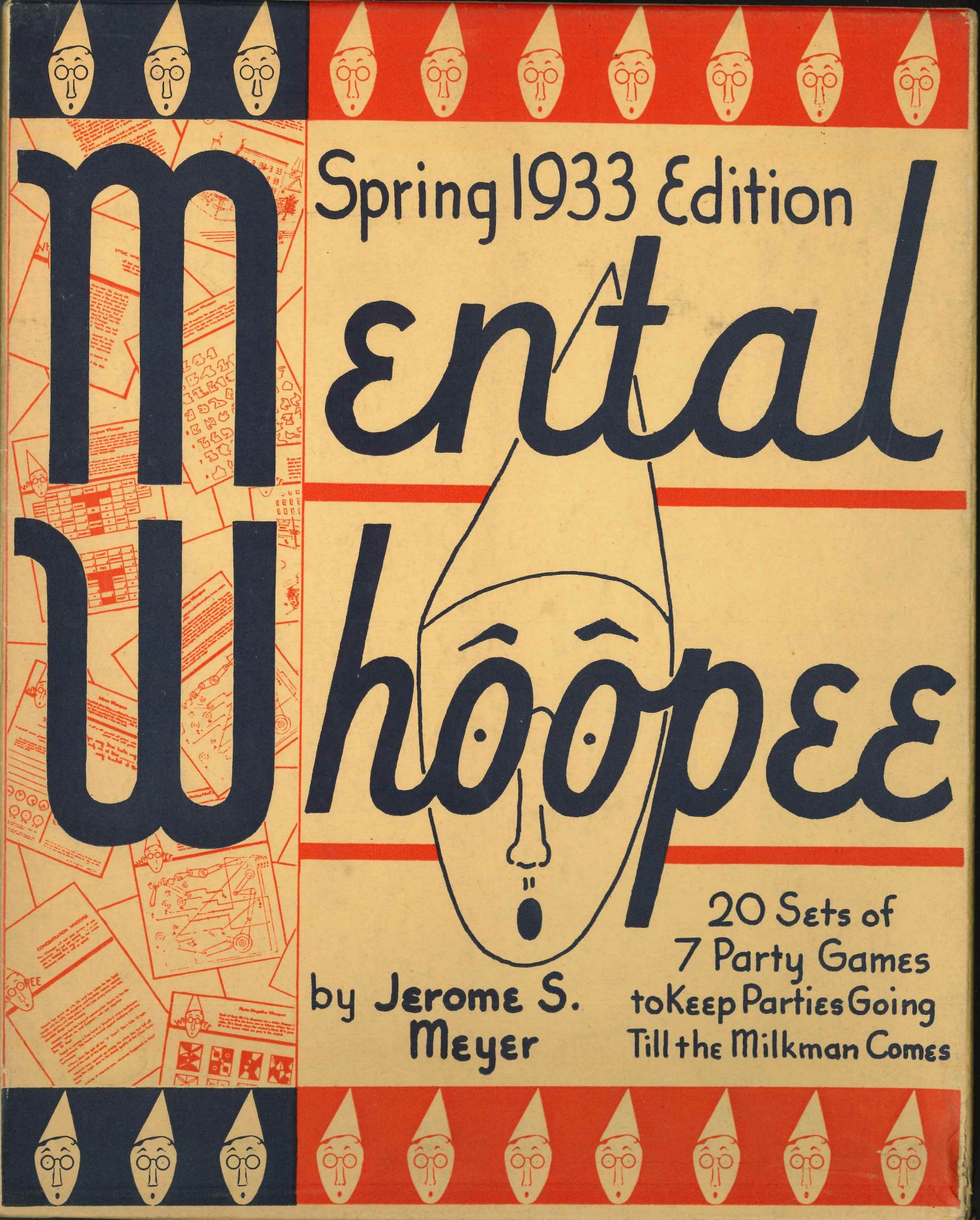

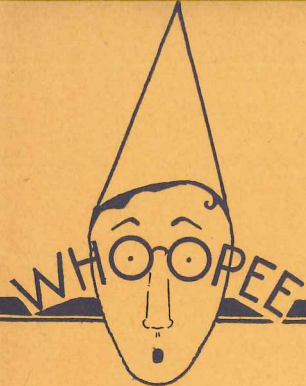

## LOGIC WHOOPEE

Hank is guilty.

The reasoning is as follows: Either Red is guilty or he is not. Suppose he is: then 3 of Red's statements are false, which is contrary to fact. Hence Red is **not** guilty and Shorty's only false statement is "Red is the guilty man." Shorty is consequently innocent and "Joey and I are pals" must be true. Joey is therefore innocent, since his only false statement is "I never saw Shorty before." The guilty man is either Hank or Tony. Red's only false statement is "I never saw Hank," since his second statement is verified by one of Joey's true statements; hence Hank's statement "Red knows me" is true. Hank's last statement is true, since it coincides with one of Joey's true statements. Hence one of Hank's first two statements is false. The last 3 of Tony's statements are obviously true, hence Hank did not lie when he said he never owned a revolver. Hank's only false statement is therefore "I did not kill Donovan." This does not contradict Hank's other statements since he need not own a revolver to use one and he could have been in Philadelphia the night of March 17th.
